Summer Workshop 2021 COVID-19 Protocols, Policies and Procedures
***As of May 2021**

Before Camp Policies

- Bring your own hand sanitizer
- Pack multiple masks (1 mask per day is recommended)
- Negative Covid test within 10 days of workshop (unless fully vaccinated)
 - Rapid Covid test available upon arrival
- All staff members and workshop volunteers will be fully vaccinated

Upon Arrival Policies

- Families to pull up to camp in a bus loop formation and families come out one at a time
- Registration check-in times will be staggered and participants/family members must be masked
- A digital form must be completed before check in. The digital form to be signed by participant and parent/guardian will include:
 - OASL Summer Workshop Policies and Guidelines
 - OASL Assumption of Risk, Release, Consent & Waiver Forms
 - OASL Acknowledgement of Covid Policies
 - Capital University Assumption of Risk, Release, Consent & Waiver Forms

Duration of Summer Workshop Policies

- Face mask to be worn properly indoors when not eating
- Students will eat with the same delegates at every meal for contact tracing purposes
- Daily symptom checks each morning via Google Forms
- Temperatures will be taken by staff as students walk out of dorm

Councils, Council Placements & Residence Hall Rooms

- As much as possible, camp activities will take place in small groups (councils) of 12
- Students will be placed in residence hall rooms with a roommate who is part of their council
- Cleaning supplies will be available for common spaces and classrooms

Materials

- Each participant will have their own program book/folder and writing utensils
- Participants will not exchange materials at camp to the greatest extent possible
- Any materials that are used by multiple people will be sanitized and cleaned after each use. This includes students sanitizing their own hands before and after use

Meals/Dining

- Students will eat meals with council members in the dining hall
- Will follow Capital University's protocols in the dining room

Large Group

- When the whole camp needs to meet for sessions, students will be required to sit socially distanced
- Outside spaces will be used to the greatest extent possible

What happens if a student shows symptoms of COVID?

- When any participant exhibits at least 3 symptoms of COVID-19:
 - Participant will be required to immediately isolate in their residence hall room and pack their belongings
 - Parent/Guardian will be called to pick up their participant
 - Contact tracing will occur with participant's roommate and council
 - Anyone deemed within close contact (closer than 3 feet for 15 minutes or more unmasked) will have their parents/guardians called to decide if they want to go home or stay at camp and will provide a written email to OASL staff with approval and recognition of the risks associated
 - Residence hall room will be cleaned and disinfected before roommate can use it again
 - Refunds will not be given for students who have to go home

What happens if a student participant does not follow camp policies?

- 1st Offense: Warning
- 2nd Offense: Warning (from Workshop Director)
- 3rd Offense: Call home
- 4th Offense: Participant will be sent home from workshop without a refund
